Abraham Verghese

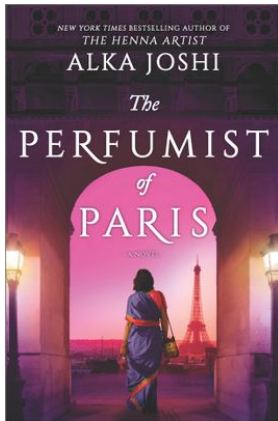

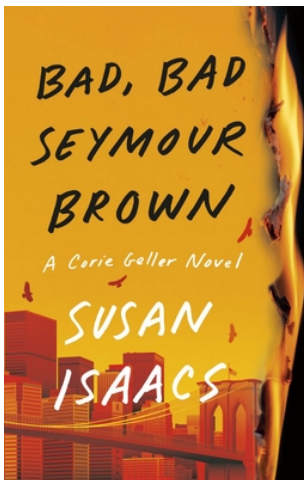

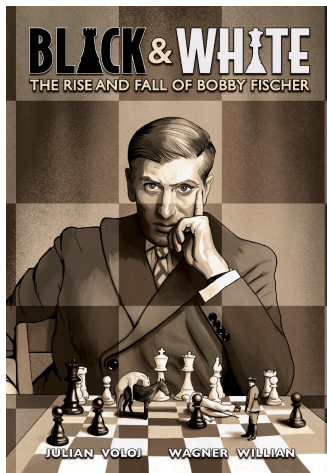
